

Maundy Thursday

Maundy Thursday is an alternate name for Holy Thursday, the first of the three days (or Triduum) of solemn remembrance of the events leading up to and immediately following the crucifixion of Jesus. The English word “Maundy” comes from the Latin *mandatum*, which means “commandment. As recorded on the last night before his betrayal and arrest, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples and then gave them a new commandment to love one another as he had loved them (John 13:34). Historically, Maundy Thursday services have often included the washing of feet and/or communion in recognition and remembrance of the acts Christ shared with his disciples on this night. Our service tonight will end in silence, encouraging us to mediate upon the events of the next several days.
